He previously served as faculty at Loyola University Medical School in Maywood, Ill. Dr. Sobotka has extensive postgraduate education in medical, physician and hospital management and specialized leadership skill training, including management in global business communities. He has completed training courses at Merck University, the Harvard School of Public Health and Wharton School of Business Academic Leadership Programs, as well as the Association of Professors of Medicine.
